RECAPPING OUR 2021 SUMMER PROGRAM

Your generosity this past year has made a profound impact on our programming and we want to shine a light on how those resources were used. So, with authenticity and honesty, I will escort you through our summer 2021 program season.

You may remember that, due to the ongoing pandemic, we had to transition to a virtual program in 2020. Three groups of new students had the opportunity to meet one another, meet staff, learn about Kismet, and engage in relationship-building activities that created a clear pathway for their return in 2021. Though it paled in comparison to what we typically do, it was vital to the success of this year's programming. That said, this summer we had a 5-week season, shorter than we anticipated because this past winter and spring we were not able to go into our sending schools and build new groups.

Our two youngest groups of the season consisted of 13-year-olds, all unique with their own stories and backgrounds. They found companionship in one another and adventure in rock climbing. Their connection to one another was so great that by departure on their final day, you would have thought they had known each other for several years, not just seven days. The third new group had similar bonds but were a year older, and their maturity allowed them to form strong connections not only with each other but with rock climbing as well. Every day they patiently learned from our climbing guides and tested their abilities at the cliff. They cheered each other's victories, advised one another during challenging routes, and progressed in their climbing abilities, leaving a sense of great satisfaction among both themselves and the guides. The house staff did an incredible job making every student feel safe, comfortable, and accepted.

The remaining two weeks of the program were fourth-year groups. These students returned to Kismet with established relationships, climbing knowledge, and an understanding of how to contribute to the Kismet family house life. Both weeks ended with a graduation ceremony to celebrate their accomplishments: accumulated knowledge of rock climbing, their consistent bravery of trying something novel, their openness and acceptance of other people, and their general contribution to the loving culture of the Kismet community.

This season radiated joy and love. It was the utmost privilege to watch new students experience Kismet for the first time and graduating classes make the most of it for their final season. I believe our mission was accomplished, as the lives of every student and staff were touched.
