This summer, we returned to eight weeks of programming, allowing us to serve more youth. In addition, we increased our school-year day programs to deepen our connection with the students and communities we serve. Fiscally, we have diversified and strengthened our fundraising revenue base to ensure long-term sustainability.

To support their emotional and social growth in a diverse, multicultural community, enhancing their ability to thrive in life. the program

We are deeply committed to every student who is invited into the Kismet program. This summer, we were thrilled to return to providing eight weeks of programs, welcoming fifty-four students. As an expansion of the program, we also hosted six day programs during the school year in our student communities to foster deeper connections.

Each week-long program is filled with transformational moments, challenges, and joy. Every Sunday, a new cohort of up to nine students arrived at the "Kismet House", some for their first, some returning, and some entering their fourth year, ultimately graduating from the program. As the students and staff gather, the excitement is kinetic. Day one is busy with a group circle, gear distribution, lunch preparation, and group planning for the week's evening activities and meals; all before circling up to develop a "core value contract" to set the stage for the week. This contract, created by the students, promises a journey filled with respect, safety, and kindness.

The weekdays are jam-packed, with an early morning start for a full day of climbing. With an intensive climbing curriculum at the core of Kismet, Program Manager Owen McAndrew alongside guides from Cathedral Mountain Guides, leads the students to area cliffs, including Cathedral Ledge, White Horse, and Echo Crag, to name a few. Each day of climbing brings new challenges and accomplishments as the students set personal goals, overcome obstacles, and cheer each other on, providing a sense of camaraderie, support, and empowerment.

Following a day of climbing, the group packs in a flurry of activities, including swimming or a visit to the ice cream shop or the park, followed by a lively, family-style dinner and maybe stargazing. The days wind down with shared chores and a discussion around the "core value contract," where the group reflects on the highs and lows of the day, listening and sharing their most impactful moments.

Saturday always comes too soon as the students say goodbye until next summer. We close each week by gathering feedback from our students, reflecting the impact of Kismet in their own words.

"Rock climbing is an experience worth more than gold to me. It presents full body engaging physical challenges in so many ways and it makes me so curious due to it's versatility. I really want to incorporate it into my future." -'25 graduate, Manchester, NH

"Kismet teaches not only how to rock climb, but techniques that actually help you in other situations, and you have so much fun while doing so. I felt so accepted and valued in the group. I really found people that make me feel like I can be me." -2nd year student, Conway, NH

We work with nine schools across four communities: including Portland ME, and the Mount Washington Valley, Coos County NH, and Hillsborough County NH. Our students, ages 13 to 17, represent a range of ethnic, cultural, and gender identities. They are from underserved communities and often lack access to extracurricular experiential opportunities due to intractable circumstances. We enroll students who are recognized for their character and resilience, but because of their circumstances often remain in "the shadows" (as described by them).

Each Kismet student comes with their own story, all having experienced some level of inequity and adversity. Our students are often identified as "flying under the radar", never creating waves but exhibiting a special spirit and earnestness as they seek peer connection, new experiences, and challenges that they aren't finding in their day-to-day lives.

While at Kismet, our students build their self-confidence, develop aspirations, and see new opportunities. We are honored to be a part of their journey as we observe them stepping into this new environment, being open to meeting new people, and tackling a rigorous rock climbing program, all while being away from their home.

As we enter this time of uncertainty, the population we serve will be impacted more dramatically as access to resources changes. Kismet will remain steadfast as a consistent and reliable friend and confidant, ensuring each of our students knows they have a place in this program and a network of staff committed to advocacy and support.



our impact

Kismet provides a space for youth to feel their value, through face-to-face experiences shared both in the dynamic world of rock climbing and through working together in a collaborative living space.

Owen shared this reflection on what he is most proud of while thinking back on the summer and the impact of our work.

"In our eight weeks of summer programming, we bare witness to countless moments that carry an intangible magic - a feeling that captures our attention and fills us with equal parts hope, joy, and gratitude. Some of these moments result from individual breakthroughs, some from peer to peer connections, and others are shared between staff and students. The moments we are most proud of are the ones where we feel this magic, and we know this magic is felt by our students. Occasionally, we directly facilitate these moments, but often, they occur naturally and on their own. We believe that the courage of our students and our unique program design enable these moments to occur."
